

Rev. Joseph F. X. Cevetello, was pastor in Garfield

The Rev. Joseph F. X. Cevetello, pastor emeritus of Our Lady of Mount Virgin R.C. Church, Garfield, died Wednesday. The Manches-ter Township resident was 65.

Before retiring in 1979, Father Cevetello was pastor of Our Lady of Mount Virgin Church for seven years.

He was ordained a priest in 1947 at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Newark. He served at Our Lady of Sorrows Church, Jersey City; Assump-tion Church, Bayonne; and Mount Carmel Church, Montclair.

In 1964, he was named chaplain and theo-logy instructor to the Fillipini Sisters at Villa Walsh, Morristown. He also served as a theology instructor at Seton Hall University; Seton Hall Prep, South Orange; Immaculate Conception High School, Montclair; and Consolata Theologi-cal Seminary, Somerville.

In 1968, Father Cevetello was appointed ad-ministrator of Holy Rosary R.C. Church, Jersey City, where he served until being named pastor at Our Lady of Mount Virgin Church. Since his

retirement, he had been serving as a weekend assistant at St. John's Church, Lakehurst.

Father Cevetello served as chairman of the Garfield Bicentennial Commission. He was a for-mer chaplain of the Garfield Knights of Colum-bus; the Garfield Catholic War Veterans; and the Garfield ambulance corps, police, and fire de-partments. He was a past state chaplain of the Catholic War Veterans and the New Jersey Nar-cotics Officers Association. He was a past na-tional chaplain of the Women's Auxiliary of the Catholic War Veterans.

Father Cevetello wrote several books, in-cluding "The Biography of St. Gerard" and "Lift Up Your Hearts." He also wrote articles for the Garfield Messenger.

Surviving are two brothers, Patrick of Sayreville and Jerome of Sea Bright; and three sisters, Mary Bertone of Union City, Jean Rogers of Lodi, and Frances Woessner of Edison.

A mass will be said Monday at 10 a.m. at Our Lady of Mount Virgin Church, with burial in St. Mary's Cemetery, Saddle Brook. Friends may
